Delivered to Epic Results in-basket





Critical Results

- Findings considered to be of "significant impact requiring immediate intervention"
- Always called to the ordering provider
- Must be provider to provider
- Document in telephone encounter



Urgent Result Alert

- Indicates an abnormality that may benefit from prompt, but not immediate, alert to aid in advancing clinical care.
- Findings do not represent a clinical emergency
- Urgent result determined by the radiologist
- VMC Radiology Results Alerts Communication Tool used for timely, closed loop communication (VRA tool)



VMC Radiology Alerts (VRA)

- Radiologist identifies an urgent (not critical) result
- Radiologist flags the result with an abnormal finding using the VRA tool.
- Epic in-basket result will be flagged for review with a green dot and 2 exclamation marks



VMC Radiology Alerts (VRA)

 The abnormal result is reviewed by a provider and marked as "Done":



- Marking the result as "Done" will close the loop on communication and a time stamp message in the VRA system.
- If result not marked as such, then a "failsafe" procedure is enacted.

Incidental Finding


- Finding is a mass/lesion discovered on imaging study performed for an unrelated reason
- Standardized, evidence-based recommendations for follow-up guidelines are on the report
- Types of recommendations:
 - No imaging follow-up recommended
 - Follow-up with different imaging modality to better characterize
 - Follow-up in future
