Lung Cancer Screening Could Save Your Life

Screening is key to early detection—if lung cancer is found at an earlier stage, it is more likely to be successfully treated.

Who is a good candidate for lung cancer screening?

Patients who meet the three criteria below are considered at "high risk" for developing lung cancer and an annual low-dose CT screening is recommended:

50 - 80 years of age

20 pack-year history of smoking (this means 1 pack a day for 20 years, 2 packs a day for 10 years, etc.)

Currently smokes OR has quit within the last 15 years
